TOILET TRAINING SUPPORT

We have been so proud of children who have quickly moved into nursery and gained independence in using the toilet. As a mum of three I know this can be one of the trickiest skills to master for our little ones and that every child is different. We will always support families and children with this however it is seen to be developmentally appropriate that children are toilet trained by the age of three. Where children are delayed in this we do see this as an additional need and as such build in support. A great source of advice is the ERIC website. :eric.org.uk As we move into the next half term we will continue to support and monitor those who need us to.

If you need individual medical support we advise that you speak with your health visitor/GP to ensure there are no underlying medical issues. We will be arranging 1:1 meetings following half term (which is a great time to try training!!) to look at making plans to support independence.

Thank you for your support at pick up time keeping older siblings away from the outdoor classroom. As we move into the very muddy season this will save your car seats too! Children love this area and we also have an enormous back garden which we will utilise more on very wet days.




Each weeks big question is designed to provoke conversation and then learning opportunities across the nursery. This week children have been thinking about houeses/homes and different types of buildings


