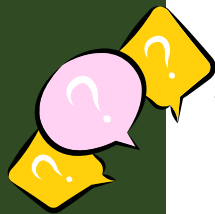

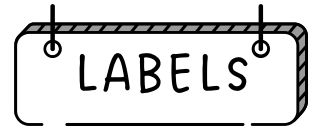
WELCOME BACK TO OUR SECOND HALF TERM AT BIRCHFIELD

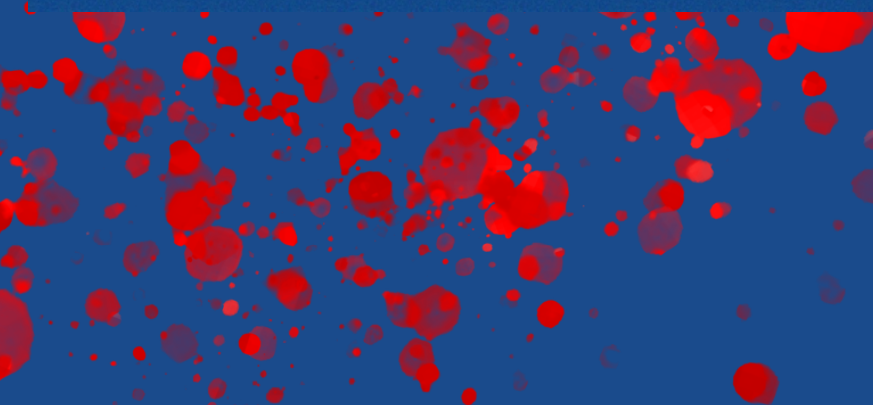

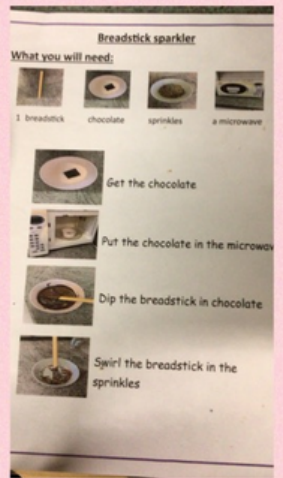
